Accident Policy

Accidents are considered to be an unplanned, uncontrolled event which causes or could cause injury. In most cases accidents can be avoided and it is our intention to prevent as many as possible.

we aim to reduce the risk of accidents by:

- The premises and all equipment are regularly checked, maintained and used properly.
- Members and visitors are made aware of Hazards.
- Health and Safety policies are in place and appropriate risk assessments completed and adhered to.
- Members identify and report Hazards.
- This policy should be read in conjunction with: Safeguarding Policy/Sun Safe/Cricket Helmet Protector policy/Concussion Policy/Health and Safety.

Accidents Involving Children:

All accidents and Incidents involving Junior players must be recorded on Accidents forms and reported to Parents/Carers.

Accident forms can be downloaded from SCB website.

Forms should be completed and signed by the person giving first aid. Completed forms should be kept confidentially in the accident/Incident file, which will be locked away. There is always at least one first aider present during matches.

Copies of accident forms should be sent to SCB

All significant Accidents should be reviewed by the management committee.

First Aid Kits are located in the **Team Kit Bag**

First Aid kits will be audited prior to the start of the season.

First aid kits will be available in the host club house and will be distributed to coaches.

It is essential that First aid equipment is checked frequently throughout the season. Therefore, ensuring sufficient quantities and that all items are useable.

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Items should not be used after their Expiry Date.

First aid kits should contain as a minimum:

- Individually wrapped sterile & waterproof adhesive dressings in various sizes
- Sterile eye pads with attachments
- 6 individually wrapped triangular bandages
- Safety pins
- Medium and large, individually wrapped sterile unmedicated wound dressings.
- Antiseptic wipes
- Sterile water/saline in secured disposable containers
- Blunt ended scissors
- Disposable aprons and gloves
- Plastic disposable bags for soiled or used first-aid dressings
